Notice of Motion: BASIC INCOME MOTION FOR SWANSEA CITY COUNCIL

The current benefits system is failing citizens and is causing hardship to many communities in Swansea. An estimated £16bn in means-tested benefits and tax credits goes unclaimed in the UK every year. Bureaucratic processes, long delays and confusing systems combine with shame and stigma to deter people from accessing income they need.

This council notes:

- a) the concept of a Universal Basic Income (UBI) where citizens are paid a non-means tested sum from the state to cover the basic cost of living, which is paid to all citizens individually, regardless of employment status, wealth, or marital status.
- b) the potential for UBI to address key challenges such as inequality, poverty, precarious employment, and loss of community through:
 - i) giving employers a more flexible workforce whilst giving employees greater freedom to change their job;
 - ii) valuing unpaid work, such as caring for family members and voluntary work;
 - iii) removing the negative impacts of benefit sanctions and conditionality;
 - iv) giving people more equal resources within the family, workplace and society.
- c) the work of the UBI Lab network in developing proposals for pilots to test a UBI;
- d) that the Senedd Cymru passed a motion on the 30th September 2020 calling on the Welsh Government to a) establish a UBI trial in Wales and b) lobby the UK Government for funding to establish a Wales-wide UBI;
- e) that Wales' Future Generations Commissioner, in The Future Generations Report 2020, made a recommendation that Welsh Government explore opportunities to pilot a universal basic income.

This council:

- 1) believes that testing a UBI in the UK is needed;
- 2) believes that the success of a UBI pilot should not be measured only by impact upon take-up of paid work, but also the impact upon communities and what the people within them do, how they feel, and how they relate to others and the environment around them;
- 3) believes that, given its history of social innovation, wealth of expertise, and active networks across community, business and public services, Swansea is ideally placed to pilot a UBI;
- 4) resolves to work with UBI Lab Swansea & Wales to prompt discussions within and beyond the city around a basic income;
- 5) resolves to send a copy of this Motion to the Secretary of State for Work and Pensions, the Chancellor, the leader of the party in Government, their counterparts in all opposition parties in Parliament, the First Minister of Wales and to all Swansea MPs.
