11 Disclosures of Personal and Prejudicial Interests.

In accordance with the Code of Conduct adopted by both Authorities, no interests were declared.

12 Minutes.

Resolved that the Minutes of the West Glamorgan Archives Committee meeting held on 15 September 2023 be approved as a correct record.

13 Archive Relocation - Update of Design Team.

Andrew Gardner and Tracey McNulty verbally updated Committee on the current position relating to the new Y Storfa facility which is being developed in Swansea City Centre.

The aim is that the new facility will open in spring 2025 and the contractors are currently on site and involved in the strip out/demolition phase of the project.

They outlined that Chris Woods of the National Conservation Service has been involved at each stage of the development and design of the archive aspects of the building and has given expert advice on a wide range of topics including physical and electronic security, fire and environmental conditions.

The issues and timescales around the aim of achieving the BSI standards and the aim of getting the service reaccredited were detailed. Staff would be given the appropriate training to oversee the efficient operation of the strongroom.

The amendments and revised layout of the searchroom and proposed management arrangements relating to the issues around the monitoring of the strongroom were explained and outlined in detail.

Members of the Committee asked various questions of the officers regarding the update and the proposals for the building who responded accordingly.

A site visit to the facility would be arranged for all members of the Committee in due course.

The Chair thanked the officers for their updates and outlined that a site visit would be welcomed.

14 Report of the County Archivist.

The County Archivist presented a report which outlined the work of the Joint Archive Service during the period September – November 2023.

Relocation of the Archives to the Y Storfa - City Centre Hub and Other Project Work

Further to the verbal update provided earlier in the meeting, the County Archivist provided an update on the revised plans for the searchroom following agreement to remove the document lift.

The revised plans were displayed to the Committee.

He outlined that he believed the new revised layout was a great improvement on the previous version as it is now larger in size and incorporates increased numbers of PCs, a coat/bag storage area and room for a small sales outlet.

He detailed the amendments made regarding the redesigning of the searchroom and relating to the use of the staff lift between searchroom and strongroom. He indicated that management arrangements agreed so that only archives staff would be in the lift when transporting documents to and from the strongroom.

Tracey McNulty concurred that the new design is an improvement and should add value to Y Storfa. The new searchroom, in association with the other facilities in the building like the new library, citizens advice, meeting rooms etc should hopefully increase both footfall and 'dwell' time.

The County Archivist also outlined that the National Conservation Service had provided training to staff relating to the photographic collections held by the Service.

Use of the Service

He reported on the figures relating the use of the service via its various platforms both in person and online.

Outreach and Educational Activity

He reported that two schools have received sessions during the quarter and sessions have also been run for students of both Swansea University and University of Wales Trinity St David.

Staff have also provided talks to three groups and organisations during the quarter.

He had attended various different events during the quarter and outlined that the service continues to run a monthly session for the Glamorgan Family History Society, Swansea Branch.

Staff

He reported that the new Archives Trainee Ffion Kidwell had started on 5th December. The filling of the post has allowed the service to resume its two day opening at the Mechanics Institute in Neath alongside volunteers from the Neath Antiquarian Society.

Professional Meetings and Training

He listed the various professional groups and meetings that he had attended during the quarter.

Accessions of Archive Collections

The County Archivist detailed the various archives received by the Service during the quarter.

1 Use of the Service

Statistics for December 2023 to February 2024

The number of members of public using the Service on-site, December 2023 to February 2024, was **643** and the total number reached by the Service on and off-site was **780**.

2. Outreach and educational activity

Service to schools

Archives staff have delivered education sessions to the following schools during the quarter:

The Service has also been involved in a collaborative group with the Teacher Education department at Swansea University, Richard Burton Archives, South Wales Miners Library and Partneriaeth to produce some easy access archival resource packs for teachers. Several meetings have taken place of the group during the quarter.

NPT Heritage Forum

The Service continues to deliver a monthly session for the Glamorgan Family History Society, Swansea Branch.

3. Wales Broadcast Archive

The Wales Broadcast Archive Clip Corner was launched on 15th January with a small ceremony hosted by the National Library of Wales. Although the Clip Corner will only be located there for the time that the Archive Service remains in Swansea Civic Centre, there will be a new Clip Corner incorporated into Y Storfa in the space occupied by the South Wales Miners Library.

4. Issues regarding the Archives online catalogue

The primary means by which customers are able to search the Archive Service catalogue (and that of Neath Antiquarian Society Archives) is provided online on the Swansea Council website. The online catalogue stopped working in October 2023 due to a software upgrade problem. Work is ongoing with the Swansea Council IT department to find a solution but progress has been slow. Our catalogues are also available in their entirety on the Archives Hub, so the Archive Service website has been changed to direct users to this as an interim measure.

5. Digital preservation

As has been reported previously, the Archive Service has been a strong supporter of a consortium approach to the issue of digital preservation (the archiving and permanent preservation of born digital and digitised records). The consortium which has taken shape in the past months consists of West Glamorgan, Glamorgan, Gwent, Conwy and North East Wales Archives plus Cardiff and Swansea Universities and the University of Wales Trinity St David (UWTSD). Provision has been made in the budget to pay for the annual subscription to the commercial provider of these services.

External funding is expected to be available to support a short-term post to assist with the process of setting up the digital repository and this Service has been in discussion with Swansea University and UWTSD about submitting a joint application for such funding. The anticipated match-funding requirement is expected to be in the region of circa £5K.

Members are requested to permit the potential use of the Training reserve to support such an application, in the region of expenditure indicated, should such an application be made and be successful.

6. Staff

Members are also requested to permit the use of the Training reserve to fund an Archive Trainee for 2024/25 on a one year contract.

Katie Millien, Archivist, left the Service in January in order to take up a post with Carmarthenshire Archive Service, with special responsibility for setting up a service to that county's schools. Katie had been a valued member of the team for over sixteen years and her contribution to the work of the Service, particularly in setting up our own service to schools, is immeasurable. The post has been advertised and will hopefully be filled shortly.

As I outlined at the last meeting, this will be my last report to this Committee before my impending retirement. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Committee for their interest and support over the past twenty years and can assure members that procedures are also in place to recruit my successor, as a full-time post.

7. Professional meetings and training
