- 3.1 An application for a new premises licence was received by this authority on the **27**th **June 2023**. The applicant has applied for a premises licence to allow the following licensable activities to take place:

Supply of Alcohol

Monday – Sunday 0600 hours to 0000 hours

4. Background

The property is situated in the centre of Tycoch Square. The area is a mix of commercial and residential properties. This premises was formerly a clothing store. This is a small convenience store. The store will also add many other services for the local community, such as bill payments, parcel service, etc.

A list and location plan of licensed premises in the area is attached at **Appendix B1.**



- 1. A Comprehensive recordable CCTV system will be installed and maintained covering the trade areas whilst encompassing all ingress and egress to the premises. The system must continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain at the premises. The system must be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality, in particular facial recognition. All recordings must be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time. Recordings must be made available immediately upon the request of a Police or Authorised Officer.
- 2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. - 6. A log shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The log shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the Council at all times whilst the premises are open.
- 7. Premises to keep up to date records available for inspection of staff training in respect of age-related sales.

I am in receipt of the above application made under the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 for the below mentioned premises.

Premises: 3S Convenience Store, 95, Carnglas Road, Sketty, Swansea SA2 9BN

The above premises has applied for a New Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003. South Wales Police to object to the application on the following grounds.

The application has specified that the proposed opening hours are Monday to Sunday 06:00 – 00:00 hours.

The property is situated in the centre of Tycoch Square and the area is a mix of commercial and private residential properties.

Convenience stores and shops have historically attracted an element of anti-social behaviour as they tend to be a congregational area.

There are other stores within the area which close at 22:00 and 23:00 hours and there are concerns in relation to the opening hours until midnight.

This will attract members of the public driving into the area due to the convenience store being open until midnight.

This would create not only a high level of noise with vehicle but also persons talking and potential disorder due to persons having already consumed alcohol and wish to continue.

There are many families and elderly people living in this area which should the closing time of midnight be granted, this would have a detrimental effect on school children, members of the working public and the elderly.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to meet the four Licensing Objectives under the Licensing Act 2003, namely The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, The Prevention of Public Nuisance and The Protection of children from Harm.

I would suggest that on the balance of probabilities that having checked all the other premises in the Sketty area with their closing times being 22:00 and 23:00 hours that this convenience store will attract members of the public not only within the locality but outside the area.

This could cause anti-social behaviour, further alcohol issues and disturbances in the street due to public wanting to continue consuming alcohol at such a late hour.

The role of a Premises Licence holder requires a high level of responsibility and the ability to manage a licence premises to a competent and high standard on a day-to-day basis.

The Licence holder will be responsible for the safety of the public and any issues that could potentially arise in respect of the convenience store which would undermine the four Licensing Objectives.

South Wales Police submit that this is a reasonable and proportionate response to this application and the above information is submitted for your information and consideration.

I am objecting to the alcohol licence for the above premises specifically the request to serve alcohol between 22:00 hours to 24:00 hours. Currently licensed premises in the area do not sell off sales of alcohol after 22:00 hours.

I object on the grounds that this licence between 22:00 to 24:00 hours is counter to the following licensing objectives.

1. the prevention of crime and disorder.

Granting a licence till 24:00 will bring in trade from a wider area since off sales for alcohol currently end by 22:00 in nearby locations.

This area is already popular with young people meeting up late at night. Therefore, the sale of alcohol till 22:00 may encourage anti-social behaviour and the possibility of underage drinking.

There is residential house next to this shop which is owned by the former licensee of the Vivian Arms Pub in Sketty who is against this application and understands the issues raised by late night off sales of alcohol.

Kip McGrath education centre is next door to this premise which is obviously used by young people.

There is also a block of flats at nearby Carnglas Court occupied by the over 50s who might be disturbed by anti-social behaviour.

I have looked up the Police crime map for this area over the past few months. The main crime is violence and sexual offences with some anti-social behaviour. It is fair to say that the overall level of crime is low. We are anxious to keep it that way. However if an off licence is granted up to 24:00 hrs this will encourage the purchase of alcohol off sales from outside the area.

Thank you for attaching the process document for obtaining a Licence to sell alcohol. I hope that the details below conform to the structure you were hoping I would achieve. I should mention the link in the Guidance for Interested Parties document is no longer valid and gives a 404 error (page not found)

Also, can you advise if a hard copy is required if the objection below is deemed in a fit state to submit.

From the document I can see that there are four licensing objectives. My intention is to link my initial objections to the objective(s) most suitable.

• The prevention of crime and disorder;

• It is generally quite quiet in Tycoch Square after 9pm but the fear is that a late-night opening shop and off licence would attract groups to hang around and consume alcohol and become rowdy. As mentioned below there is already a small-scale amount of that happening in the area.

• Public safety.

• Parking for the shop customers and as other 3S shops have deliveries, for the delivery drivers is minimal and hotly contested and will be with the takeaway 3 doors down. At peak times the adjacent Kip McGraw facility causes a lot of drop offs and pickups, There is a forecourt that may allow some parking but this crosses the path where children will be walking and having lived here for 25 years I can tell you some of the drivers are not as careful or considerate as you would expect. There has only been one accident I am aware of, but I have seen many near misses of cars into cars and people.

• The prevention of public nuisance;

- I believe that this would mean the shop would expect to open during those times and given its immediately below a flat and next to other residences I think this would cause quite a lot of noise disturbance for the residents. This would especially be the case as other premises run by the applicants have deliveries sent out within the hour so there will be cars and opening and shutting of car doors.
- Planning application 2018/1371/S73 requested later opening times for the takeaway and the decision was to refuse and the reasons given can be read here 2018 1371 S73-FINAL DELEGATED PANEL REPORT-772225.pdf (swansea.gov.uk)
- There is a concern that this could attract groups to hang around especially as we are aware of such groups drinking around the front of the Bluebell when the Cafe is closed and in nicer weather in the grounds of the flats.

• The protection of children from harm.

The proposed licensed premises is immediately next door to a Kip McGrath where
young children will be passing by and multiple times a day. This increases the risk of

I was a little surprised to receive your email response as I believe my points of objection to be relatively self-explanatory but please find further details below.

I am specifically objecting to the sale of alcohol between the hours of 22:00 and 00:00. There are other licensed premises in the vicinity that are not permitted to sell alcohol after 22:00 and I believe the grounds for this application should follow the same format.

I object on the grounds that a licence between 22:00 and 00:00 hours is counter to the licensing objectives as detailed below.

- The prevention of public nuisance issuing a licence until 00:00 will result in trade from a wider area as the sale of alcohol has not been granted after 22:00 in the vicinity.
- Overprovision as per my initial email there is a Co-Op store open 7 days per week, 07:00-22:00 which is located only a few doors away.
- The prevention of crime and disorder as per my initial email and in addition there are already groups of young people who congregate in the area the additional 2 hours of alcohol sales may encourage anti-social behaviour and the consumption of alcohol by those underage.

Dear Licensing Division,

With reference to the licensing request associated with number 95, Carnglas Road, Sketty (formerly Betty Ann Fashions).

We understand that number 95 is to be a Convenience Store, and the new occupants have applied for a licence to sell alcohol. Apparently, they have requested that the licence extends from 6 am to midnight.

We object in the strongest possible terms to the granting of this licence. The only reason anyone would buy alcohol at such a late hour would be for immediate consumption. Otherwise, normal shop hours/licensing hours would suffice. This being the case, one may safely infer that such people have exhausted other possibilities and are seeking to increase their level of intoxication, and that this is the primary objective.

This being the case, there would inevitably be a significant increase of drunkenness and disorderly, irresponsible behaviour in the immediate vicinity of 95, Carnglas Road, and quite probably an increase in episodes of drunk driving on the surrounding roads.

It goes without saying that drunkenness leads to an increase in crime, a threat to public safety, and a nuisance to the residents of the surrounding area. It is also worth noting that many of our

neighbours have young families, and even though it is unlikely that children would be out of the house at such an hour, they would still suffer the effects of being exposed to an increased noise level, drunkenness, foul language, vandalism, violence and aggressive behaviour. It would also set an appalling example to the young and impressionable teenagers in the locality. It is the responsibility of local government to combat addiction problems, not facilitate them.

In short, there can be no right or valid reason to grant this licence. The only people who would find it useful are those who are buying alcohol for the wrong reasons.
