Report of the County Archivist West Glamorgan Archives Committee 21 September 2018

The purpose of this report is to outline the work of the Archive Service during the period June to August 2018

1. Use of the Service

Statistics for June to August 2018

The number of members of public using the Service on-site, June to August 2018, was **1,431** and the total number reached by the Service on and off-site was **1,601**.

2. Service outreach

Exhibitions and events

The Archive Service combined with Swansea Museum, the Dylan Thomas Centre, Richard Burton Archives Swansea University and Women's Archive Wales to create three versions of an exhibition celebrating the centenary of the (albeit partial) extension of suffrage to women in 1918.

The larger, more academic touring exhibition is currently on display in the Swansea Civic Centre foyer, to be followed by the Women's Archive Wales conference in October then Taliesin Create on the Swansea University campus. The smaller touring exhibition has been and will be displayed at the following Swansea venues: Volcano Theatre; YMCA; Terrace Road Primary School; African Community Centre. A fixed exhibition will be installed from mid-September to the end of the year in Swansea Museum. Students at the University of Wales Trinity St David created a short film to go with the exhibition.

The Service would welcome more bookings (and particularly more bookings from schools and from venues in Neath Port Talbot) for either of the two touring exhibitions.

Work is underway to commemorate the centenary of the end of the First World War with an online resource on the WGAS webpages. The Service holds a number of WW1 rolls of honour, which generally have been rescued from businesses, churches and chapels when they closed. The project aims to make the images of the documents, indexed names of those who served, and any further contextual information available online. The intention is for this to go live on 11 November 2018 and to link the launch to the UK-wide 'Explore Your Archive' marketing campaign later in November.

Publications

There are two final publications pending in the Archive Service's publications programme, both of which will be published in the next few months. The programme has been funded from a joint publications reserve which is almost exhausted.

'The Parish of Llangyfelach: Landed Estates, Farms and Families' by Jeff Childs will be published shortly. It is intended that the launch will take place in Penllergaer in the autumn. The book is a long and authoritative history of an upland parish including much historical information about landed estates which straddled both present-day local authority areas and beyond. Therefore it will be of interest to a geographically wide audience of those interested in Welsh history. It will be a joint publication with the author and the stock will be shared equally between the two parties. The author is a regular speaker to local history groups and he will combine future talks with book sales and signings. For its part, the Service will be able to provide shop and online sales.

While the capacity to publish hard copy books may disappear, the Service is currently exploring the possibility in the future of creating and selling eBooks through the Service's online sales outlet. This will allow the republication of popular WGAS titles that have sold out in hard copy. It could also enable the Service to reproduce classic publications by local historians if they are out of copyright, as was done in hardback form some years ago with W H Jones' 'History of the Port of Swansea' and Walter de Gray Birch's 'History of Margam Abbey'. It is intended to test the market with a small publication from the former Swansea City Archives which has long been out of print, entitled 'The Enclosure of Townhill'.

4. Staff

The Archive Trainee for 2018/19 will be John Moffat. John is a recent MA graduate in History from Glasgow University and comes from Dundee.

The County Archivist has over the quarter assisted in the project planning and process of recruitment of two trainees for the cultural heritage sector, traineeships to be funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and supported by Cardiff and the Vale College who will award an NVQ Level 2 on completion of the placements. The Archives is one of the venues for the trainees during their year-long placements in venues in Swansea and Llanelli. The two trainees are aged between 18 and 24 and are NEETs.
