The Partnership Agreement provides the legal framework through which the regional collaborative will operate and fulfil its responsibilities in delivering an adoption service with paramount consideration being given towards ensuring the welfare of the child is met and improving outcomes for those children whose plan is adoption. There is no evidence to suggest that any of the protected groups would be adversely affected in the delivery of the service and it is envisaged that collaborative working will promote equal opportunity for prospective adopters and those requiring support services by ensuring consistency of response and approach. The proposals provide a pathway for creating an effective and responsive National and regional adoption service and will help to more effectively recruit and support adoptive placements and reduce delays for children waiting for placements.
