Section 1: Constituency activities

I held surgeries for all Dunvant residents each month from 10 am – 11 am in Dunvant Social Centre. I was and continue to be available by email – cllr.jennifer.raynor@swansea.gov.uk or by telephone 01792 207807 and at the Guildhall on 637429.

Issues raised this past year include dangerous parking on pavements, blocking the way for pedestrians. Inconsiderate parking near Dunvant Primary, blocking in local residents who want to go to work. Parents in cars not looking out for other children on foot when they try and park and pull off. This is a serious issue and I have tried to involve the Police and parking enforcement, however it does not appear to be a priority for either of these two organisations.

Residents asked me to improve traffic safety on Dunvant Bridge by providing a white line in the centre of the bridge. The white line was painted on the road.

I have used my Councillor's Environmental Allowance to extend the planting of wildflowers within the Dunvant area and on road safety schemes to improve safety at the junction of Dunvant Road and Goetre Fawr where children have to cross the road.

I am a member of the Friends of Dunvant Park group. I attend their meetings regularly and liaise with relevant Cabinet Members on issues which the Friends Group raised.

I used some of my Environmental Allowance to support the Friends grant application to fund more equipment. I also used some of the Allowance to plant wildflowers in Dunvant Park at locations requested by the Friends Group.

I attended PACT meetings and was (and still am) in regular contact with our Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's).

I was (and continue to be) a Governor at Pen-y-Fro Primary School and Olchfa Comprehensive School.
