Conducted street surgeries in a number of areas, picking up issues such as street signs, pot holes, parking, children's play equipment, dog mess, and a number of other matters then taken up with the council including individuals issues and problems too.

Held regular surgeries for constituents, dealing with housing, development, social services, street maintenance, parks and numerous other matters related to the council, giving advice and assistance whenever possible.

Met regularly with officers from West Cross Housing Office to discuss and address matters relating to the wellbeing of tenants and the housing estate in West Cross.

Met with businesses locally to work to help sustain them and help them add to the locality.

Worked to increase safety around local school, including 20mph limits, yellow lines, increase parking patrols, signs, and trying to make parents aware of the dangers they create and the benefits for their children of walking to school, including Grange, St David's and Llwynderw.
