### Section 1: Constituency activities

I attended monthly PACT meetings and took up issues raised with officers and delivered a regular six weekly newsletter to every home in the ward.

Together with my fellow ward Councillors we took up a number of issues. These included:

Offered support to a local group seeking to restore Babell graveyard

Lobbied the Post Office to reopen a branch in Manselton

Used Community Funds to help improve security at Cwmbwrla/Manselton Community Centre

Reported and had fixed a large number of potholes in the area

Got the council to complete landscaping around the Burlais School car park

Arranged the planting of wildflowers in key areas of the ward

Pressed planning enforcement to regularise opening and closing times for businesses in the former Blyth's premises

Continue to press drainage to tackle flooding in Eaton Road

Used the Neat Team and cleansing to keep on top of fly-tipping and litter in the area. Pressed network rail to spray knotweed behind Courtney Street

Made Richard Street and part of Courtney Street one way Part funded new play equipment for Cwmbwrla Park

Arranged with Coastal Housing for barriers to be put in place to stop parking on the pavement in Pleasant Row

Agreed with Housing Association that the new development on the former Cwmbwrla School site will be called Clos John Charles

Opposed cuts in opening hours at Brynhyfryd Library

Offered support to Circus Eruption in bringing St Luke's Church back into use Had pedestrian guard rails replaced in David Street

Have worked with the new owner of the former Manselton School to keep the site secure

Taken up numerous complaints about recycling, refuse collection, dog mess, litter, housing problems and many more.

### Section 4: Initiatives and Special activities

Together with my fellow ward Councillors, we delivered a newsletter to every home in the ward every six weeks and used this newsletter to highlight to constituents investment in our education system by the Welsh Liberal Democrats Education Minister. We continued to challenge the ban on black bags being taken to the Penlan recycling centre and the limit on three black bags being imposed on householders. We also opposed the above inflation council tax increase of 6.7% passed in February 2019, pointing out that a band B council tax increased to £1,246.16 a year. That is 38% more than in 2012, or £343.68 extra in a full year.
