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Section 1: Constituency activities

I have continued to deal with casework issues approaching the relevant council officers, community groups etc as appropriate. I have always responded to a constituent regardless, even if the outcome is not the answer they might wish. Where there have been multiple issues I have continued to liaise with residents & officers, to resolve as much of the concerns raised as possible. I have also continued to hold my regular monthly surgeries in the Phoenix Centre, and the occasional Street Surgeries knocking on doors where I offered help if required.

I have continued to produce regular newsletters to update residents on ward activities, and sent Welcome letters to new ward residents. And As school governor I have moved to Dylan Thomas, attending two meetings so far.

I have continued to attend TOPIC House PACT meetings, attended by various groups for older people including Townhill Ward Residents, and two specific events: The opening of the extension in Jun14; and the service to commemorate WW1 in November 2014.

In addition to council committees I have continued to sit on various outside bodies: <u>Communities 1st West Cluster</u> Steering Group, Ward Member, and Community, Forums <u>Hill Community Development Trust</u> runs facilities in the Phoenix Centre, and <u>Townhill</u> <u>Community Centre Committee</u> which administrates all activities held in the centre.

Section 4: Initiatives and Special activities

As one of the TMG Team of Labour Councillors, I have

- continued to get more dog bins placed when requested by residents
- as well as getting certain road blocks removed, giving easier access to emergency vehicles, managed to get unsightly bollards either repainted or removed altogether
- Initially instigated by myself, wild flowers were planted in various sites across the ward

I have started three ongoing initiatives during this year:

- getting the unsightly barbed wire replaced, and repaint the rusty gates, alongside the reservoir on Townhill Road, both of which have been tentatively agreed by Dŵr Cymru
- working with Communities 1st, have begun to develop a long term plan for Mayhill
 "Washing" Pond, to return it to a picnic area, and supported the work done so far
- with the help of the convenor of the Environment & Transport CAC have begun a review of all issues around waste management, from collection to fly tipping

Other events & meetings I have been attending

- White Ribbon Day, to shoe my support to those who suffer from domestic abuse;
- on Renewable Energy projects, aimed both to involve & benefit the community;
- in various venues following the progress of the Tidal Lagoon project.

Section 5: Learning and Development

I attended the following training session: 31/10/2014 - Safeguarding Actually carrying out the role of councillor has given me a whole range of experience, knowledge and new skills which I have been able to put to good use.

Section 6: Other activities and issues

I have carried on with my involvement on the Swansea Bay Fair Credit group, which has certainly played a part in getting the UK wide interest cap imposed. In tandem with this I also remain very committed to supporting LASA Credit Union, which provides its members an alternative option to all loan sharks, both legal & illegal. I have also continued to publicise Foodbanks in and around Swansea, and set up a collection box in the Labour Group room.
