### **Section 1: Constituency activities**

My previous work experience, as teacher, advisor at CAB, and housing officer, all help me deal with residents' casework sensitively & effectively. Within the constituency:

- 1) I have continued to deal with casework issues, liaising with council officers etc, always get back a constituent to let them know the outcome
- 2) I have held my regular monthly surgeries in the Phoenix Centre, and also cover for my colleagues as required in other ward venues
- 3) Together with my ward colleagues, we have been working hard to address a number of ward issues :
  - safety of children playing on Phoenix Centre roundabout
  - traffic calming measures needed for Townhill Road
  - speeding on Meadow Street
  - parking around Seaview School
  - match funding with our community budget to provide play facilities at Mayhill Park
  - quad bikes damaging Gors Playing Fields
  - fly tipping down the ravine from Lady of Lourdes roundabout
  - We will continue to do so until suitable resolutions have been found.
- 4) Also with my colleagues I have over the past year supported the annual Phoenix Funday, looked into providing cycle routes across the ward using the WG's Active Travel fund, and again agreed to three ward locations for wild flowers.
- 5) As well as council committee meetings I also attend
  - meetings and other events as LA Governor of Dylan Thomas Community School, and also provide advice & support, acting as liaison between school and the local authority
  - board meetings of the Hill Community Development Trust, based in the Phoenix Centre, and continue to give particular support on marketing the services the centre provides, and forwarding information that I receive as a councillor, such as & job opportunities, and updates for those on benefits
  - meetings of Financial Inclusion Steering Group, complimenting the work that I have been involved in on the Poverty PDC, in particular in enabling Swansea to set up a Poverty Truth Commission
