## **Section 1: Constituency activities**

Schemes Delivered Across Morriston in 2017/18 - We delivered a number of schemes across the Ward, listening to your requests, concerns and issues, including the following:-

- Wild Flowers and Floral Displays across the Morriston Ward;
- Organising and funding the Morriston Christmas Switch On for 2017. This year we
  doubled half of the Christmas lights on the lighting columns on Woodfield Street and
  as in previous years liaised with lead Council Officers, Morriston Tabernacle, Forest
  Traffic Services, Morriston Fire Service, South Wales Police, The Wave, the Christmas
  Market, Phoenix Choir, Morriston Ladies Choir, St Johns Ambulance, and Morriston
  Comprehensive and Morriston Primary Schools. With special thanks to Kev Johns and
  Belle and all the families who took part in the lantern parade.
- New road sign & a new bench at Bwllfa Rd and Plascadwgan Road and "No Through Road" sign on Tirpenry Street
- Parking issues near Cwmrhydyceirw Stores In addition to our previous commitment
  to tackle indiscriminate parking near the stores, we funded additional guardrail at the
  pedestrian crossing from our Councillor Community Budgets following concerns for
  residents and children's safety when using the crossing.
- Flashing sign on Heol Maes Eglwys and removal of the chicanes on Heol Y Fran
- Continuing to work closely with South Wales Police to try and resolve issues of ASB on Woodfield Street and attending a number of PACT meetings
- We have held weekly surgeries every Saturday morning at Morriston Library

Transport & Green Vehicle Adoption (inc infrastructure works); Homelessness and Supporting People; Homes as Power Stations (City Deal); Housing Adaptations & Renewal Schemes; Housing Policy, Affordable Housing & Housing Options; Lead Elements of Sustainable Swansea; More Homes Delivery; Poverty Reduction; Sheltered Housing; Tenancy Enforcement; Welsh Housing Quality Standard (WHQS)

During 2017-2018, I have worked extensively on areas of delivery within my portfolio, these are just some of the highlights for last year. Our first Council Homes in almost 4 decades (10 x 2 Bed Family Homes and 8 x I Bed Apartments built to "Passivhaus" standard) are now fully occupied at Colliers Way. We also made good progress on our second pilot site at Parc Yr Helyg in Birchgrove. We have applied for Welsh Government Funding (IHP2) to fund solar panels and battery storage for these homes, this could mean that they would create more energy than they use over a year, built to "Swansea standard" using the Homes as Power Stations model (City Deal), using our direct workforce. Corporate Building Services who did outstanding work on our first pilot site. This development also supports the provision of apprenticeships to help develop our next generation of young tradespersons.

- We continued to make significant progress on the wider More Homes Development Programme, which will inform how we develop future Council-owned sites to deliver much needed affordable housing in Swansea.
- We continue the major investment of £169.5m (between now and 2020) to bring our Council homes up to the Welsh Housing Quality Standard (WHQS), using the Housing Revenue Account. The programme delivers works such as new kitchens, bathrooms, boilers and enveloping works to improve the energy efficiency of our homes to benefit our Council tenants.
- We trained a team in-house to begin our retrofitting for our Sprinkler Installation Programme in our High Rise Blocks.
- With the help of the Council Events Team, we held our second "Clean Air Road Show" promoting zero-carbon emission vehicles. The event was support by our local public and private sector partners as well as commercial car manufacturers. We also expanded our Corporate EV Fleet are currently working on our Corporate Green Fleet Policy
- We continued delivery of our Corporate Energy Strategy and Carbon Reduction Strategy and are currently considering the establishment of a Council arms-length energy company.
