<p>1</p>	<p>Councillor A M Day</p> <p>In relation to Minute 24 ‘Councillors Questions’ Question 1</p> <p>Can Councillors be provided with a list of the 40,000 gullies in Swansea together with a schedule of their frequency of cleaning.</p> <p>Response of the Cabinet Member for Environment Enhancement & Infrastructure Management</p> <p>It is not currently possible to produce a meaning full list of individual gullies however they are available to view via The Councils Geodiscoverer mapping system via the intranet.</p> <p>Currently cleaning frequencies are not listed however the inventory is gradually being updated and the service hopes to eventually show cleaning frequency for each asset on the mapping system.</p>
<p>2</p>	<p>Councillor P N May</p> <p>In relation to Minute 24 ‘Councillors Questions’ Question 1</p> <p>Can Councillors be provided with a list of the 40,000 gullies in Swansea, outlining their location and means of identifying each one, thus making it easier for a Councillor to report which gully requires cleaning.</p> <p>Response of the Cabinet Member for Environment Enhancement & Infrastructure Management</p> <p>It is not currently possible to produce a meaning full list of individual gullies however they are available to view via The Councils Geodiscoverer mapping system via the Intranet.</p> <p>The gullies do not yet have an individual numbering system, the best method for identification is by road position for example High Street o/s no 13. This tends to be how Councillors, the public and the Service currently identify gulleys.</p> <p>It is intended to number the gulleys and to make this information available via the mapping system.</p>
