#### Report of the County Archivist West Glamorgan Archives Committee 10 December 2021

The purpose of this report is to outline the work of the Archive Service during the period September to November 2021

## 1. The COVID-19 pandemic and service point reopening

The Swansea service point is now operating by appointment only with a capacity of eight customers at any one time, four in the archive searchroom and four in the Family History Centre. The latter facility is under-used, as may be expected when many of our core users have lost the habit of dropping in as part of their social routine, however the archive searchroom is well-used (by these more limited standards), particularly by university students, amateur local historians and academics. The next steps for the Swansea service point in returning to normality will be to expand the service's opening hours towards back to where they were pre-Covid.

An onsite meeting took place on 29 November with Neath Port Talbot Council Health and Safety staff to identify what COVID safety measures would need to be in place for the Neath service point to re-open. At the point of writing this report, it is too early to outline these measures in detail (since they still need the agreement of both the Council and the Neath Antiquarian Society) but I hope to be able to give a verbal update in the meeting on what has been agreed. The key aim of reopening would be that public access to the Antiquarian Society's archives would be restored for researchers, rather than the family history service there.

#### 2. Potential relocation of the archives to the proposed City Centre Hub

The project has progressed during the quarter but the key question remaining is whether it is possible to integrate a secure archive storage area into the multi-use building in a manner which will meet British Standard 16893, *Specifications for location, construction and modification of buildings or rooms intended for the storage or use of heritage collections* and BS 4971 *Conservation and care of archive and library collections.* 

The Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) have undertaken a significant amount of work during the quarter towards achieving this goal, including commissioning assistance with detailed thermal modelling work from Chris Woods of the National Conservation Service. As reported previously, there are three key documents on which the decision depends (the fire and security risk assessments and a thermal modelling report) and these were re-issued by the MDT on 26 November.

Conformity with the two British Standards in turn affects the ability of the Service to meet the Archives Accreditation Standard and its status of recognition by The National Archives Kew as a local Place of Deposit for public records. As a result of this element of external regulation, Welsh Government and The National Archives will be the ultimate arbiters on whether the proposal meets the relevant criteria, and their considered response is not yet available at the time of writing.

In the last meeting, Members requested a report on the work that Carmarthenshire County Council undertook to create a purpose-built archive repository using Passivhaus standards. This report is attached at Appendix 1. It has been selected from original project documentation kindly provided by the Carmarthenshire County Archivist, to whom I am very grateful.

#### 3. Accreditation review

Since late 2019, the Accreditation status of the Archive Service has been set as provisional, while Swansea Council sought a suitable alternative home for the collections. Provisional status requires an annual assessment, the date for review falling on 4 November this year. The Panel confirmed the continuation of provisional status for a further year.

The Accreditation Panel were "pleased to see [Swansea] Council seeking appropriate expert advice on meeting relevant standards as part of preparatory work towards a new home for West Glamorgan Archive Service....The Panel note that to move back to the full award of Accreditation, it will be essential to have a plan which meets the needs of collections and their users, and safeguards the unique heritage of West Glamorgan for future generations."

## 4. Outreach and educational activity

#### Service to schools

The Service has this autumn relaunched its service to schools using remote meetings on Microsoft Teams as a means to deliver each learning session. Two schools have so far taken part, reaching 138 pupils in total:

Casllwchwr (on the subject of the Three Nights' Blitz) Gowerton (on the subject of the Elba Colliery disaster)

A remote learning session consists of the archivist sharing the selected material beforehand with the teacher, introducing the same resources to the pupils in the lesson via Teams, setting them a number of tasks and then holding a feedback

session at the end. Although not as effective as a hands-on session for children in the archives, these could represent a more economical replacement for a visit by Archives staff to a school site, particularly for more rural schools, where travel time is a significant cost to the service.

The County Archivist also trialled a module entitled 'Black lives in eighteenth century Wales' with Swansea secondary school history teachers after attending their network meeting. No feedback from them has as yet been received.

## External events

In another first since the pandemic, the County Archivist staffed a WGAS bookstall at the Glamorgan History Society Day School in Bridgend on Saturday 30 October. This was the first face-to-face local history meeting held for some time and, although not well-attended, represented a welcome step away from remote meetings.

#### **Explore Your Archive**

Each year, a nationally co-ordinated campaign to raise awareness of archives takes place in November called 'Explore Your Archive'. Of necessity, the last two years have been dominated by social media marketing around a number of set themes. The Archive Service took part in the campaign by providing images to the campaign coordinator using a number of nationally chosen hashtags, such as 'Going Digital', 'Conservation Nightmare' etc.

#### 5. Use of the Service

#### Statistics for September to November 2021

The number of members of public using the Service on-site, September to November 2021, was **175** and the total number reached by the Service on and off-site was **313**.

## REPORT ON THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF CARMARTHENSHIRE ARCHIVES

Members may recall that Carmarthenshire County Council was at one stage considering a joint facility with West Glamorgan Archives and Swansea University. However, a decision was made in 2016 by that Council to create a Carmarthenshire-only facility and it was then decided with a budget of £2.6m to build an extension to Carmarthen Library with an archive repository built to Passivhaus standards.

The following information is more technical and is selected to show the parallel process undertaken by that Council in designing its archive repository. To avoid any confusion, it is worth noting that the British Standard in operation at the time of the planning work described here was PD 5454 which had in turn replaced BS 5454. This has now been superseded by BS EN 16893 and BS 4971, which are the Standards referenced in Swansea Council documents. Although the numbers have changed, the Standards remain fundamentally similar between different versions.

## **Design Brief**

At the outset Carmarthenshire County Council was extremely mindful of the high level of energy costs associated with document repositories to comply with the requirements of the previous BS5454:2000 which set out the requirement for close control air conditioning for repositories with a temperature range of 13 to  $16^{\circ}C \pm 1^{\circ}C$  (on either side) and a humidity range of 45 to 60% RH ± 5% (on either side) so with the update to this standard with PD5454: 2012 where the control conditions were relaxed for the repositories and allowing the conditions to vary for seasonal changes with the internal conditions allowed to fluctuate between 13 to 20°C and 35 to 60% RH, this allowed for an alternative approach to the construction and servicing of this new facility in Carmarthen.

Herefordshire Council had recently completed the construction of their Herefordshire Archives and Records Centre (HARC) facility using Passivhaus principles and following a site visit and further discussions it was decided that replicating the Passivhaus design for the Carmarthen Archive would be the preferred solution. Piers Sadler Consulting (heavily involved with the HARC project) was employed as part of the design team to provide guidance to the in-house design team and Carmarthenshire County Council.

Piers Sadler produced a pre-planning advice document (see next section below) outlining the Passivhaus principles to the construction. A Passive House Planning Package (PHPP) model was developed by him to inform the initial guidance for the building construction, air tightness and environmental conditioning. The report shows that the environmental conditions within the repositories would remain well within the required temperature limits.

The key points from this report are:

• Building construction using materials with a high thermal inertia and high levels of insulation to maintain stable internal space temperatures;

- An extremely airtight construction to minimise natural air infiltration and moisture ingress to maintain stable humidity levels;
- Minimise the heating load in winter and providing minimal space heating to maintain a minimum space temperature of 14°C.
- Minimise the summer heat and humidity impact from the outside ambient air by providing supply air into each repository where this supply air is de-humidified to maintain stable environmental conditions.

## Taken from the preliminary Piers Sadler report 2017:

Archive buildings present significant challenges in terms of structure, fire resistance and hygrothermal stability. The benefits of simplicity in form and construction cannot be overstated for the success of a building such as this.

The proposed strategy is to couple the repository with the ground (no floor insulation) thereby keeping the repository relatively cool so that it needs a small amount of heating in winter but no cooling in summer. An air permeability of less than 0.2m/h is recommended as a provisional target for the repository. This is easily achieved with a simple form and good details using 'plaster' as the air barrier. This level of airtightness is to help ensure stable conditions with the proposed passive environmental control and is beyond the normal Passivhaus requirements which would apply to an office building. Preliminary modelling indicates that this strategy should be workable with a simple form, no windows, constructions and internal heat gains.

## Taken from the Piers Sadler pre-planning advice note

The Carmarthen Archive project provides an opportunity to build on the experience from Herefordshire Archives and Records Centre (the first archive in the UK built to Passivhaus standards), achieving the required environmental conditions with very simple and low cost heating ventilation and air-conditioning (HVAC) systems. The proposed new building includes a repository of about 420m<sup>2</sup> and adjacent office and ancillary spaces of about 270m<sup>2</sup>. The requirement for the building, including the office and the repository is to meet the Passivhaus Standard. In addition, for the office, the intention is to optimise the design for the building users by:

- achieving better than Passivhaus levels of over-heating
- design glazing for optimal daylight and views out.

The additional requirements for the repository are:

- to meet the standards set out in PD5454
- to achieve this with simple HVAC plant and controls to avoid the high capital and operating costs of the complex plant which is typical of such buildings.


PD5454 stipulates the following environmental conditions for a repository of this type:


- indoor temperature 13-20°C
- relative humidity 35-60%


The PD temperature requirements are lower than those of a typical office building and therefore this can help keep the overall energy demand down. This makes achieving the

Passivhaus energy demand more straight forward and means that the principal challenge for the building design is the simplification of the HVAC plant for the repository.
