The purpose of each of these three Strategic Plans is to gain support for and commitment to delivering co-ordinated actions that improve the quality and resilience of the local environment through increasing Biodiversity and Green Infrastructure and the many beneficial Ecosystem Services they provide. This report relates only to the process of preparing the three strategies. Therefore, the overall impact of this report is considered positive but relatively low.

Once developed and agreed these strategies will provide the shared ambition, priorities, governance and monitoring framework to ensure the effective and collaborative delivery of actions that make a positive contribution to Nature Recovery. It is anticipated that the draft strategies once prepared will be subject to a further IIA screening as part of their signing off process.

Initial consultation feedback has been very positive. Plans for continuing with more general engagement include a series of awareness raising presentations and workshops with key internal and external stakeholder groups during the Autumn, together with targeted community engagement at a local (ward) level.

The proposed Strategies and Plans are 100% in line with the Well-being of Future Generations Act (in particular the Resilient Wales Goal), as well as the Environment (Wales) Act 2016, the Swansea Well-being Plan, the Council Corporate Plan and Natural Resources Wales' Area Statement for South and West Wales. There are no identified risks in preparing these Strategies and Plans. Risk would arise from not preparing them.

These are essential Strategies and Plans required to meet the Council's legislative, corporate and partnership responsibilities to ensure Nature Recovery and respond to the declared Nature Emergency. There are no significant risks associated with this project, the project has been scored as 'low risk' and the outcomes are all deemed positive, therefore a full IIA is not deemed necessary
