The procedure involves having the arrangements independently assessed to ensure they are in the best interests of the individual concerned, the person being deprived should be provided with a representative and the person subject to a deprivation of liberty has the right to challenge a granted authorisation. Our team focus on strengths, enablement and keeping people safe. A positive co-productive approach and advocacy is embedded in the DoLS / DoLO processes.
