1.1 A consultation exercise was conducted over the period 6<sup>th</sup> November 2023 to 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2023. An on-line survey form was placed on the Council's website and consultation forms were available at the Contact Centre, Area Housing Offices and libraries. Information was also sent to members and precepting authorities and a press release was issued.

## 1.2 Summary of Responses

- a) A total of 53 responses were received. 44 were completed online and 9 written responses received.
- b) 50 responses were completed by individuals and 3 responses were completed by the following organisations: -
  - Mental Health and Money Advice.
  - Swansea Young Families, Action for Children.
  - Swansea Young Families.
