One of the impacts is intended to be an increase in community cohesion with increased ability to apply legislation to improve housing conditions. The review was in part carried out as a result of calls from residents to improve conditions in their local areas and also to comply with a statutory timescale for review of the existing policy. Information is already available on our website, bilingually and updates and amendments will continue to be available this way. It is intended that, subject to ICT developments, in due course, applicants for HMO licences will be able to submit their applications online. There is a statutory process to follow for applications and the granting of licences. There is a cost involved for landlords as the Council levies a licence fee set on a cost-recovery basis as controlled by the legislation. In normal circumstances this is for a licence which is granted for five years. There is the possibility that landlords will pass this cost on to their tenants, but this is the same for any costs they incur in letting a property.
