Aims:








Integration of health and social care is making a significant contribution to the wider Health and Social Care Community. Joint commitment to delivering Community Services enables:

- Support for people to remain independent and keep well
- More people to be cared for at home: shorter stays in hospital if unwell
- Change in the pathway from institutional care to community care
- Fewer people asked to consider long term residential or nursing home care
- More use of technology to support people
- Services are joined up around the needs of the individual less duplication across health and social care agencies
- More treatment and care provided at home, as an alternative to hospital admission
- Services available on a 7 day basis
- Earlier diagnosis of dementia, and quicker access to specialist support for those who need it


This means that we are now delivering:

- Services that support people remain confident independent and safe in their own homes for as long as possible, and in accordance with their dignity and choice
- Services that are coordinated to reduce the number of unplanned admissions into hospital and long term care, and support timely discharge when a hospital admission is deemed appropriate.



Achievements to Date

A total of £3,237,494 has been saved:

- £2,155,454 annual cashable savings achieved to date through assessment and embedding the process
- £802,399 annual avoidance savings through the brokerage system achieved to date
- £279,640 annual avoidance through negotiating uplift costs






