9 Report of the County Archivist.

The County Archivist presented a report which outlined the work of the Joint Archive Service during the period September - November 2022.

Use of the Service

He reported on the figures relating the use of the service via its various platforms both in person and online. The numbers using the service continue to rise slowly.

The figures relating to the online usage for 2021 would be circulated following the meeting.

He indicated that unfortunately the problem with the broadband at the Mechanics Institute remains ongoing. He outlined that he has a meeting with Officers in NPT next week to try and progress the issue.

Ancestry staff had attended Swansea Civic Centre during the quarter to re-digitise in high definition and colour the parish registers held by the service, this will improve the online provision for the public. Volunteers from the Glamorgan Family history Society had also returned for the first time since the pandemic to continue their indexing of records held by Archives.

National Broadcast Archive

He outlined that progress on the project remains slow, some of the hardware has been installed at Swansea Civic Centre but the facility is unlikely to be open to the public until possibly next summer due to the delays from the National Library for Wales.

Outreach and Educational Activity

He outlined that 2 of the bids for funding had been successful, unfortunately the digitisation project relating to Wales' link to the slave trade had not proved successful.

School visits had re-commenced for the first time since the pandemic with four visits being undertaken.

He outlined that Archives staff have been involved with discussions with the regional education body Partneriaeth regarding the use of information and documents held by the service as part of the new curriculum for Wales that is being introduced.

Professional Meetings and Training

He outlined the various professional groups and meetings that he had attended during the quarter.

Relocation of the Archives

He indicated that the design for the new archives facility is currently at RIBA stage 4. This stage relates to the technical design and the key important factor is that the new facility conforms to BSI 4971.

Some amendments have been made to the design relating to the cavity wall around the storeroom since the last meeting following input from the National Conservation Service. A dehumidifier will also now be installed.

Further updates on the progress of the scheme will be provided at future meetings.

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The Archive Service is jointly funded by both the City and County of Swansea (CCS) and Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council (NPTCBC). Each authority is responsible for agreeing their level of contribution as part of their respective budget processes, always in the ratio of 68% (CCS) and 32% (NPTCBC).
- 1.2 This report includes the detailed 2023/2024 budget, shows the required contributions agreed by each Authority and lists the expected balances on reserves.

2.0 Revenue Budget 2022/23

- 2.1 The budget for 2023/24 is expected to be £330,750, compared with the 2022/23 budget of £311,150. In line with the City and County of Swansea's budget assumptions an approximate increase for the Pay Award of 7% has been included. No other price increases have been assumed.
- 2.2 The increase of £19,600 is as a result of the Pay Award. The intended use of the Archives Training Reserve to fund a new trainee post is also included in the increase of salary costs. The detailed budget is shown in Appendix A.

2.3 The required contributions from the two partners are:

3.0 Reserves Summary

Report of the County Archivist

The purpose of this report is to outline the work of the Archive Service during the period December 2022 to February 2023

1. Use of the Service

Statistics for December 2021 to February 2022

The number of members of public using the Service on-site, December 2022 to February 2023, was **505** and the total number reached by the Service on and off-site was **666**.

The service at Neath, which has been badly affected by the lack of access to the internet since it reopened post-pandemic, has remained in this unfortunate Page 7

situation throughout the quarter, although a resolution of the situation now appears very close, with a new contract with our internet service provider and with Neath Port Talbot Council offering to provide replacement IT equipment for the outdated public PCs.

ICT equipment and cabling has now been installed ready for the opening of the Wales Broadcast Archive Clip Corner in the Swansea searchroom.

2. Outreach and educational activity

Service to schools

During the quarter the Archive Service has engaged with 208 pupils and teachers from the following primary schools, mostly in searchroom visits

Clydach Cwmrhydyceirw Primary School (3 visits) Pen-y-Bryn Special School Tirdeunaw (2 visits and one remote session)

Although NPT schools have been much slower than Swansea schools to reengage with the service post-pandemic, curriculum teams from both authorities are working with the Service to create content for the 'cynefin' element of the new Curriculum for Wales.

Exhibitions

The Service lent original items to Swansea Museum for their exhibition on Twentieth Century Swansea, due to open shortly. It has also lent items on Dylan Thomas' acting career for an exhibition at the Dylan Thomas Centre.

The portable exhibition banners 'Jewish Refugees in South Wales 1939-1945' were loaned out for the official Swansea council commemorations on Holocaust Memorial Day.

The Service is preparing an online exhibition for release in May recalling the way past royal coronations were celebrated locally.

3. Fees and charges for 2023/24

At the request of Swansea Council, all fees have been uplifted for the coming year by approximately 15%, as part of the savings target for the Council. Some rationalisation of charges has occurred across Swansea Council's cultural venues. Members are asked to approve the table of fees and charges attached at Appendix 1.

4. Relocation of the archives to the City Centre Hub

Work continues on the design of the new archive storage area at RIBA Stage 4 to ensure that the City Centre Hub facility meets British Standard 4971. A study has also commenced to assess the feasibility of bringing together a number of archive collections, research and learning facilities, in one 'fit for purpose' repository, able to house multiple partners that together secure access to our heritage and long-term benefits for current and future generations. The contract has been awarded to the National Conservation Service.

5. Staff

After a gap of several years, a new Archive Trainee, Bethany Amos, was appointed with a start date of 7 March. Longer-serving members of the Archives Committee will recall Mrs Rosemary Davies, who served as Principal Archivist for many years and who sadly died suddenly in January.

6. Professional meetings and training

Archive staff have attended a number of professional working groups and undertaken training during the quarter as follows:

Neath Port Talbot Heritage Group Wales Broadcast Archive Project Team

Andrew Dulley took part in the Practice of History lecture at Swansea University. The County Archivist was interviewed as part of the consultation for a proposed national recognition scheme in Wales for culturally significant collections. Several Archive staff have undertaken training in diversity awareness, antiracism and Black history in the new Curriculum for Wales.

The Service has taken delivery of a stand-alone PC for training in digital preservation. Given that the world has for the most part shifted from paper to digital as the preferred format for recordkeeping, the archives of the future are likely to be almost exclusively digital in format and the Service must adapt to this new reality through having both capable and trained staff in digital preservation and the facility to store digital records permanently.
