2 Welcome/Thanks.

The Chair indicated that following a revision to portfolio responsibility in NPT Council, Craig Griffiths had indicated he would be attending his final meeting today.

She thanked him for his contributions and advice to the committee over the years.

She also welcomed Chris Saunders, Head of Culture, Leisure, Heritage and Tourism to his first meeting.

3 Minutes.

Resolved that the Minutes of the West Glamorgan Archives Committee meeting held on 24 March 2023 be approved as a correct record.

4 Election of Vice Chairs for the Municipal Year 2023-2024.

Resolved that the election of the Vice Chairs be deferred to the next meeting.

5 Report of the County Archivist.

The County Archivist presented a report which outlined the work of the Joint Archive Service during the period March – May 2023.

Use of the Service

He reported on the figures relating the use of the service via its various platforms both in person and online.

He outlined that the use of the service is steadily rising following the pandemic and the various lockdowns.

He outlined that the Wales Broadcast Archive is due to be launched on July 11th, and he would look to arrange a visit for committee members to view the facility at the civic centre in due course.

He outlined a breakdown of the statistics of where people are from that use the service, which is obtained via the Archives Card reader tickets.

He referred to IT issues that have been experienced at the Mechanics Institute due to the age of the computers there, which had to be replaced due to potential security issues. This should be rectified very soon, and new machines installed.

Following a question from Janet Watkins regarding the usage statistics, he indicated he would happy to include the visitor numbers at the mechanics institute for when the facility is open and staffed by the Antiquarian Society's volunteers. These would though have to be recorded separately from when archives staff are present due to reporting regulations.

The issue of the decline in family history enthusiasts attending both the Civic Centre and Mechanics Institute was discussed along with the factors affecting the issue.

Outreach and Educational Activity

He referred to the publication of the service's annual report which went online at the end of May.

The number of schools to whom staff have delivered educational sessions was outlined.

Several sessions were also held for Swansea University students, and staff also delivered talks to various different groups during the quarter.

Relocation of the Archives to the City Centre Hub

He detailed that work remains ongoing and continues to evolve the design of the new facility in Swansea city centre to ensure it complies with British Standard 4971.

He detailed the input of both Welsh Government and the specialist external advisor Chris Woods which have led to the installation of 2 additional pieces of equipment, namely one to remove excess humidity and another around an automatic cooling system.

He referred and detailed the Accreditation process the service will have to go through at the new facility.

Staff

He outlined that the service had lost 2 members of staff in recent months, which has affected the ability to deliver a full service in both Swansea and Neath.

He outlined that the process of recruiting replacement staff is ongoing.

Professional Meetings and Training

He outlined the various professional groups and meetings that he had attended during the quarter.

Accessions of Archive Collections

He detailed on the various archives received by the Service during the quarter.

Report of the County Archivist

The purpose of this report is to
outline the work of the
Archive Service during the period
June to August 2023

1. Use of the Service

Statistics for June to August 2023

The number of members of public using the Service on-site, June to August 2023, was **455** and the total number reached by the Service on and off-site was **560**.

Additionally, a further 104 people attended the Neath Mechanics Institute during the quarter at sessions run by the NAS outside of the Monday WGAS opening.

2. Outreach and educational activity

Service to schools

Archive staff have delivered education sessions to the following during the quarter:

Birchgrove Comprehensive School Swansea

Talks to groups

The Service continues to deliver a monthly session for the Glamorgan Family History Society Swansea branch.

There have been no other talks to groups during the quarter, which is traditionally a quiet one because of the summer break.

3. Relocation of the archives to the City Centre Hub

Work continues on the design of the new archive storage area to ensure that the City Centre Hub facility meets British Standard 4971 and can achieve the Accreditation Standard. As part of the process of Value Engineering, a number of revisions have been made to the design which are yet to be approved by Welsh Government and The National Archives. A meeting around this was held on 7th September, with another meeting scheduled shortly addressing points made by WG and TNA during that meeting.

The feasibility study for a regional archive facility referred to in previous meetings was completed in August and the report has been finalised. It will be presented in the first instance to members of the City Regeneration Team who commissioned the work.

4. Grant awards relating to the move

Preparation for the move of premises is proceeding according to a 14-point plan agreed with Welsh Government and our external advisor from the National Conservation Service. Eight of the actions are ones which the Archives team can pursue in preparation for the move. They are:

1. Increase environmental monitoring in order to be able to synchronise environmental conditions in the old and new strongrooms
2. Increase pest monitoring to ensure that no insects are transferred between strongrooms
3. Carry out a Preservation Assessment Survey to assess the current physical state of the collections and develop an improvement action plan
4. Carry out an exercise with Benchmarks 3: Conservation Planning Tool
5. Improve the packaging for audio and film material originals with more suitable (sealed airtight) boxes
6. Improve the packaging for all photographic material, and arrange for the digitisation of the glass slide collection

7. Identify and centralise all the digital (and digitised) material held in the archives
8. Obtain a revised valuation for the collection prior to arranging insurance for its move

With regard to 3. above, WGAS obtained a 90% grant from Welsh Government to carry out a preservation assessment survey, which was carried out in August.

With regard to 6. above, WGAS has obtained a 50% grant from Welsh Government to digitise the glass slide collection (comprising just under 7,000 slides). This digitisation work will start shortly,

Work on 8., the valuation of the collection, and 5., the repackaging of the audio and film collection will also start in the autumn.

5. Staff

In terms of staff resource, the Archive Service is a small service of 7.5 FTE staff, hence any loss of staff has a more than average effect on the ability of the Service to meet its commitments. The two vacancies reported on in June have been filled in the last quarter. Anne-Marie Gay was promoted from Archive Assistant to the vacant post of part-time Archivist (leaving another gap). Peter Neville was redeployed from the Test Trace and Protect Team to the vacant post of part-time Archive Assistant.

The Service is now almost back to full strength and is looking to recruit one more Archive Assistant before restoring lunchtime opening in Swansea and its two-day-a-week opening hours in Neath. This will bring the weekly opening hours in two locations back from 36 to 46 hours per week.

5. Professional meetings and training

Archive staff have attended a number of professional working groups and undertaken training during the quarter (all meetings online) as follows:

Along with the Head of Leisure, Tourism, Heritage and Culture and other NPT officers, the County Archivist attended a tour of the Mechanics Institute and the NAS archive collections given by officers of the Neath Antiquarian Society.

6. Accessions of archive collections

A comprehensive list of archives received during the period June to August 2023 is attached at Appendix 1.

Interesting items sometimes turn up amongst material received some time ago which had not been processed and this has been the case this quarter in clearing out a basement storeroom in Swansea Guildhall used for archive material awaiting transfer to the main strongroom. The newly-rediscovered file contains completed forms recording the distinguishing features of unidentified corpses recovered during clearing up operations after Second World War air raids on Swansea prior to their transfer to the mortuary. It is an unusual if gruesome addition to our resources on this traumatic period in the city's history.
