Section 1: Constituency activities

I have been very active in my ward over the past year. Working closely with my ward colleagues I have held regular advice surgeries, attended community meetings and helped resolve a number of key local issues. We were all successfully re-elected in the 2017 Local elections.

Together with ward colleagues we funded and organised the Christmas lights parade and celebrations, and also funded wild flowers and flower displays throughout the ward during the summer months.

I have worked with colleagues to implement parking schemes and traffic calming measures on a number of roads, replaced lighting columns, and funded the purchase and installation of a number of Benches, bus shelters and other community priorities across the ward. We have also provided financial support to local schools and community action groups as well as securing investment for our parks

I have also spoken on a number of local planning applications during the year relaying and representing resident's views on planning matters.

I have continued to support local groups and organisations, and have attended a number of fund raisers and concerts during the year.

I have continued to push the authority forward as Leader, championing the most ambitious redevelopment and regeneration Swansea has ever pursued. I led the regions bid to secure the Swansea Bay City Deal, at £1.3bn the biggest city deal in Wales. This was signed with the First Minister and Prime Minister in March 2017. I have worked with Cabinet Colleagues to create the conditions where our schools have delivered the best education results ever achieved in Swansea, and where our Social services is preforming very strongly.

I have overseen the start of major redevelopment projects within the City. I am fully supporting the bid team for Swansea to become City of Culture 2021, and continue to lead the campaign for approval of the Swansea Bay Tidal Lagoon. I have made significant changes to policies to ensure more money is placed under community control to be spent on local priorities.

I have worked hard to build even closer collaborative relationships with our two universities and other major employers to create a 'team Swansea' approach to doing business. In doing so I have highlighted that we are a city open for business welcoming new investment to the city, creating new job opportunities within the city.

2016/17 was a great year for Swansea and the Labour Administration I lead was returned with a bigger majority in the 2017 local elections. We now have to deliver our manifesto commitment and in the coming year but people will really see physical change in the city as our new developments rise out of the ground creating new jobs and opportunities for the people of Swansea.

We plan to increase the size and scale of the scheme year on year with additional displays planned for Morriston Tabernacle, St David's Church and Ynystawe Primary School as well as other locations this year.
