## **Section 1: Constituency activities**

- Establishment of a 20 MPH zone in Grovesend in order to control traffic speeds through the village.
- Introduced the Leigh Halfpenny Bursary in partnership with Penyrheol Comprehensive School to recognise and reward the best female/male sportsperson in any given year.
- Worked with officers in protecting a part of the apron outside NISA store on Frampton Road in order to prevent a reoccurrence of the near miss resulting in an injury to an employee.
- Worked with Gorseinon Hospital management to address parking and wall safety issues on the boundary and outside the hospital.
- Worked with local businesses, Committee members, Town Council, Police and Swansea City Licensing to deliver a 2nd Community Carnival in 2014 & was treasurer.
- I was instrumental in the formation of the idea and setting up the Friends of Gorseinon Parks which includes Parc y Werin, Parc Melin Mynach and Argyle Gardens.
