#### Section 3: Councillors role and responsibilities

Member of the twelve Councillor Group that makes up the sole Planning Committee on Council.

Planning Officers now use delegated officer powers to determine most planning applications.

The Planning Committee of twelve Councillors now tends to only determine applications of a major size or applications that are contentious and cause community concerns. This can cause stress and requires sharp attention to unbiased duty.

I attended many public functions and events in my Ward. For example:- I am President of the local Senior Citizens Group and similarly I am President of the local History Society etc.

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### **Section 4: Initiatives and Special activities**

Member of the twelve Councillor Group that makes up the sole Planning Committee on Council.

This Committee had a particularly busy year working with Senior Officers to create the draft Local Development Plan LDP. It involved many, many meetings on site and in Committee Rooms.

Outside of the Council I had been very involved with Landscape Protection issues in my rural Ward, and I had spoken and given witness evidence to Public Inquiries.

Inside the Council I am free of any whip and I frequently spoke in the debates.
