Section 1: Constituency activities

Alongside my ward colleague, Cllr Jennifer Raynor, I have held monthly no-appointment surgeries open to all residents in Dunvant. I receive many casework issues via email and phone calls and ensure I respond in a timely manner, chasing up with relevant council officers and cabinet members as required. We are in regular contact with constituents via newsletters, two community noticeboards and via our Facebook page.

We continue to look at road safety concerns with local residents and council officers. We arranged for the installation of a zebra crossing on Derlwyn to aid families crossing from Dunvant Primary School and improved signage on Dunvant Square and Garrod Avenue. Other sites and solutions around the ward are being explored.

We have once again funded displays of wildflowers around Dunvant, regularly report flytipping, potholes and overgrowth and have carried out litterpicks. Alongside pupils at our local schools we have put up signs encouraging dog owners to clean up after them.

I've made bringing our community together a top priority, supporting groups and schools, and helping to organise local activities open to all such as two children's film events, afternoon teas at Dunvant Social Centre and events with Friends of Dunvant Park like the Easter egg hunt and Halloween fun day. From our community budget we funded a defibrillator for Pen Y Fro and compost for Dunvant Primary school eco-club's raised beds project.

I am a governor at both Pen Y Fro and Dunvant Primary schools and a committee member of Friends of Dunvant Park. I regularly attend PACT meetings and continue to work with our PCSOs and police officers regarding community safety, particularly concerns about Anti-Social Behaviour and irresponsible parking.
